Visit to Natural History Museum and London for Years 8 Friday 24 and Monday 27 March 2017

After careful consideration, the planned visits to the Natural History Museum and London, tomorrow and Monday, will go ahead. London remains one of the safest cities in the world and students will be closely supervised at all times. Students should follow the programmes below.

Friday 24 March 2017

8 T C P to St. Pancras London by High Speed train to meet teachers at Gravesend Station outside platform 0 at 9:15am.

8 H L O M to Natural History Museum by coach to come to school as per normal.

Monday 27 March 2017

8 H L O M to St. Pancras London by High Speed train to meet teachers at Gravesend Station outside platform 0 at 9:15am.

8 T C P to Natural History Museum by coach to come to school as per normal.

Visit to the Natural History Museum

The visit will be in normal school hours. We will be travelling by coach from school to the Natural History Museum. Students should come to school as per normal and register with their Learning Coach. We expect to be back in school by 3:00pm. As soon as the coaches arrive back students will be allowed to go home. All students must wear school uniform and should have sensible footwear, suitable for walking. As we are supporting Comic Relief, they can wear their red noses (on Friday). We will be there for the whole day so your son will need to bring a packed lunch as there is no opportunity to buy food on site. All drinks should be in plastic bottles. No glass bottles please. Students may bring some spending money for souvenirs if they wish.

Visit to St Pancras London

The visit will be in normal school hours. We will be travelling by train from Gravesend to St Pancras. Students are asked to meet staff at the station at 9:15am and will be dismissed from the station on arrival back to Gravesend at 2:30pm. If your son is not able to meet staff at the railway station he should come to school at the usual time and he will be walked down by staff to the station. Likewise, if students on the first train back are not able to get home from the station at that time, they can walk back to school and leave from there at the usual time.
